Punctuation and Capitalization

Instructions:

Cut along the dotted lines of the mat pages and tape the mat together. Have your child cut out the sentence cards along the dotted lines. Shuffle the cards and place them facedown in a stack. Invite your child to take the top card and read the sentence. Encourage him or her to identify what punctuation mark is missing from the sentence—a period, a comma, an exclamation point, or a question mark. Then have your child place the card on the mat in the correct column. Keep going until your child has sorted all 24 sentence cards.


Helpful Hint:


Explain to your child what types of sentences end with a period, an exclamation point, and a question mark. For example, tell your child that sentences that end with question marks often begin with words like "who," "what," "when," "where," and "why." Also remind your child where commas might go in certain sentences and what function they serve—in lists of items, in dates, and between cities and states.


