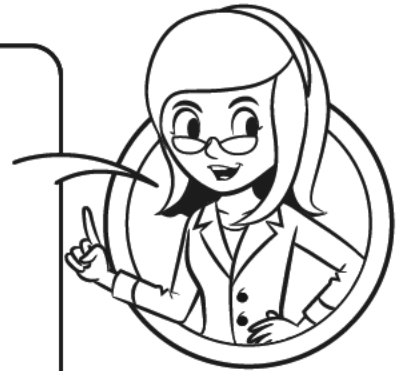
Punctuation and Capitalization

Instructions:


Ask your child to read each sentence. Point out that each one is missing capital letters and punctuation. Then invite your child to rewrite each sentence on the lines below using proper capitalization and punctuation!

Helpful Hint:

- Capitalize **holidays**.
Examples: Fourth of July, Columbus Day
- Capitalize **names**.
Examples: Bob Smith, Marla's Pizza Palace
- Capitalize the word **I**.
Example: Kelly and I are going to the movies.
- Capitalize **geographical locations**.
Examples: New York City, the Grand Canyon
- End sentences with a **punctuation mark**, such as a **period (.)**.
- Use a **comma (,)** to separate items in a list.



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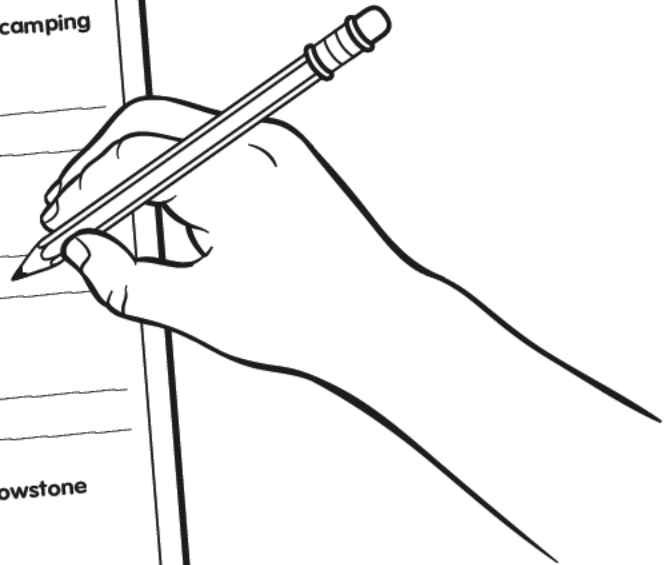

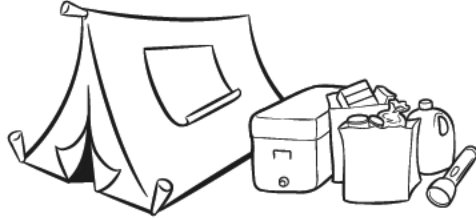
